Chabot College Student Satisfaction Survey: Fall 2017 Highlights

Students' Experiences and Perspectives on Diversity at Chabot

In Fall 2017, most students were satisfied with classes and campus activities that promoted positive interactions among different ethnic/cultural groups and increased their understanding of diverse cultures, sexualities, and ages.

Between 2015 and 2017, increases were witnessed across all four questions related to diversity, especially the ones on Chabot's efforts to promote interaction among diverse groups, and campus activities to increase students' understanding of diverse groups. All ethnic groups reported having positive experiences of diversity at Chabot and valued making diverse friends, especially Filipinos and Latinos.

The biennial Student Satisfaction Survey was conducted in October 2017 in a representative sample of 77 on-campus course sections and was completed by 1,702 students (59% full-time and 41% part-time).
